

Using Articulate Presenter in 10 Easy Steps

(Your mileage may vary.)

1. Design and save Articulate templates and libraries.
2. Develop your PowerPoint presentation, including graphics, animations, and script.
3. Add quizzes, learning games, or surveys. (You must have Quizmaker.)
4. Set up slide properties: titles, levels, movement, etc.
5. Add attachments and links.
6. Record audio, either within Articulate or with another tool; for example, Adobe Audition or Audacity.
7. If necessary, import audio.
8. Synchronize animations with audio.
9. Publish.
10. Fix mistakes, republish, repeat as necessary.

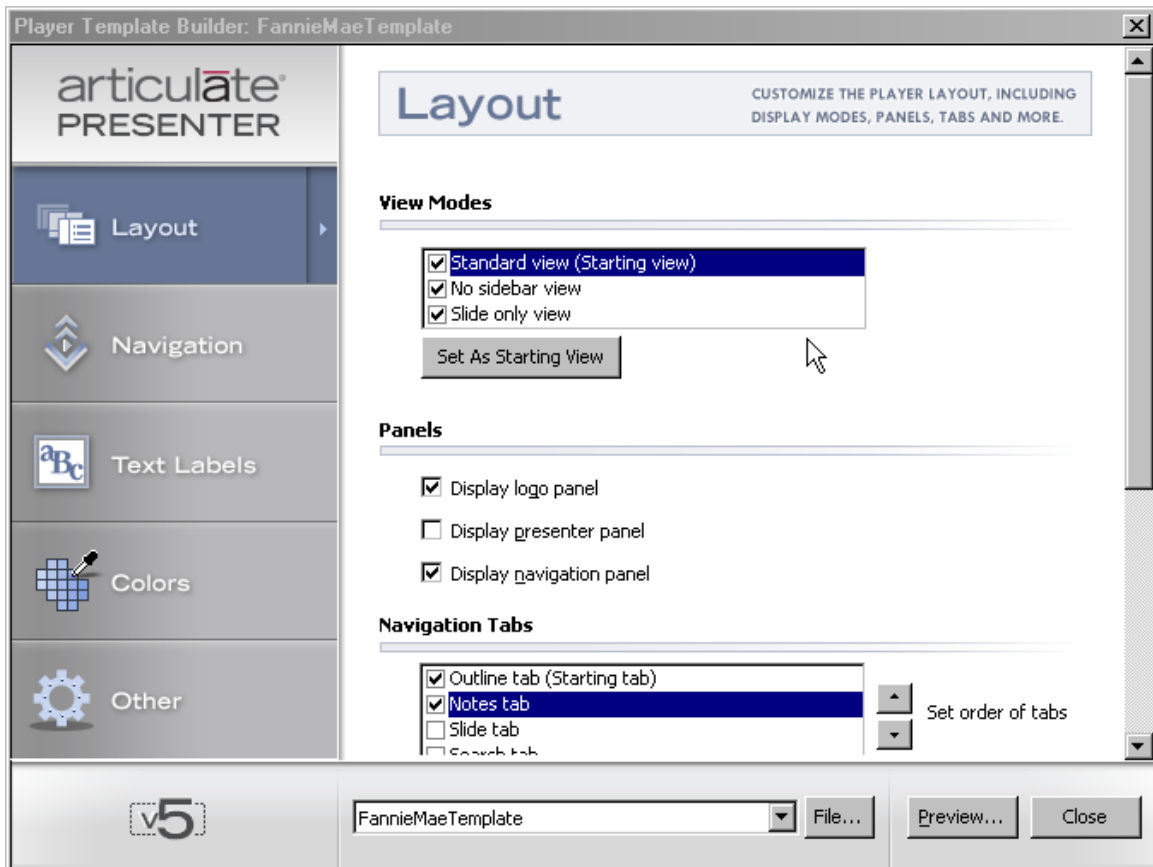

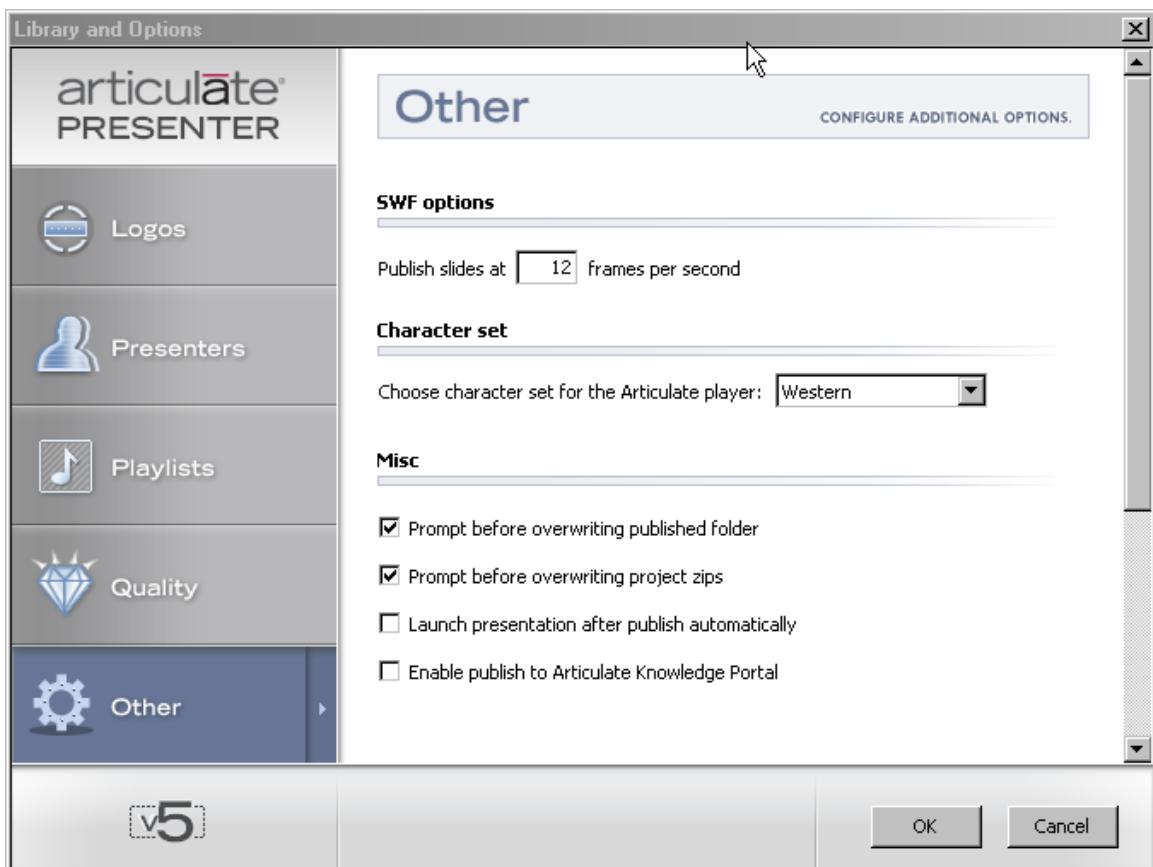

What Is A Reverse Mortgage?



A reverse mortgage enables homeowners ages 62 and over to convert the equity in their homes into cash.

Seniors can select from a variety of payment plans to suit their needs.

Generally, the loan is not repaid until the homeowner no longer occupies the property as a principal residence.

Slide Notes

A reverse mortgage is a mortgage that enables eligible homeowners (age 62 or over) to borrow against the equity in their homes. The key to a reverse mortgage is that after the loan is approved and funds are disbursed, the lender pays the borrower, rather than the borrower paying the lender. As the borrower receives funds, the loan balance increases. The balance includes principal funds, accrued interest, and servicing fees. The total amount owed can never exceed the value of the home at the time the loan becomes due and payable. If the value of the home dropped dramatically for some reason, and the balance owed was greater than the home's value, HUD or Fannie Mae makes up the difference. The loan become due and payable when the borrower no longer occupies the home; for example, when the borrower moves into assisted living or a nursing home, or when the borrower dies.

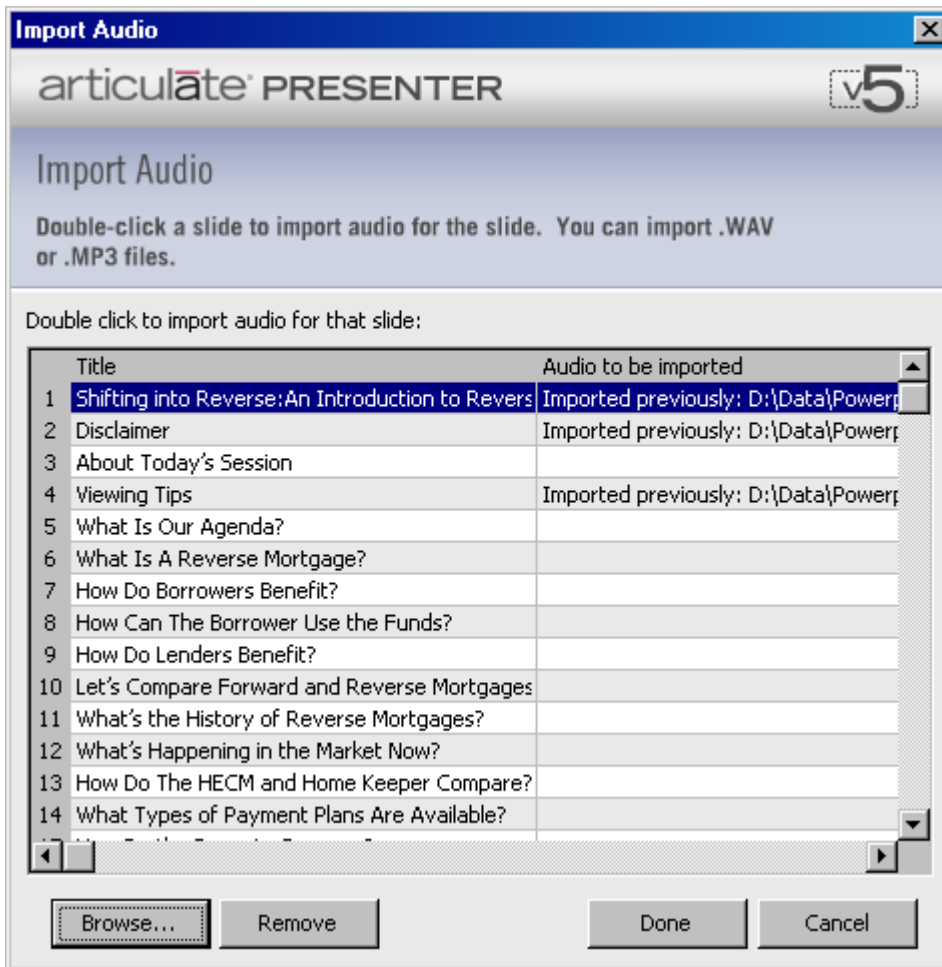

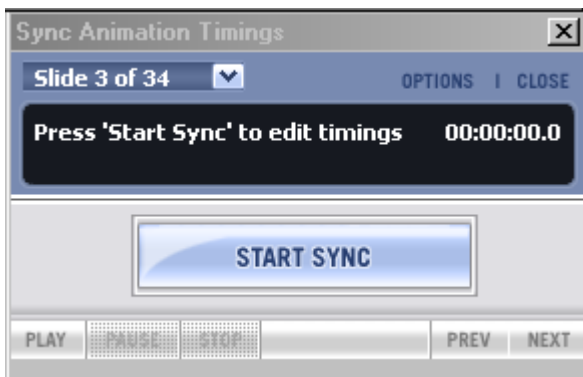

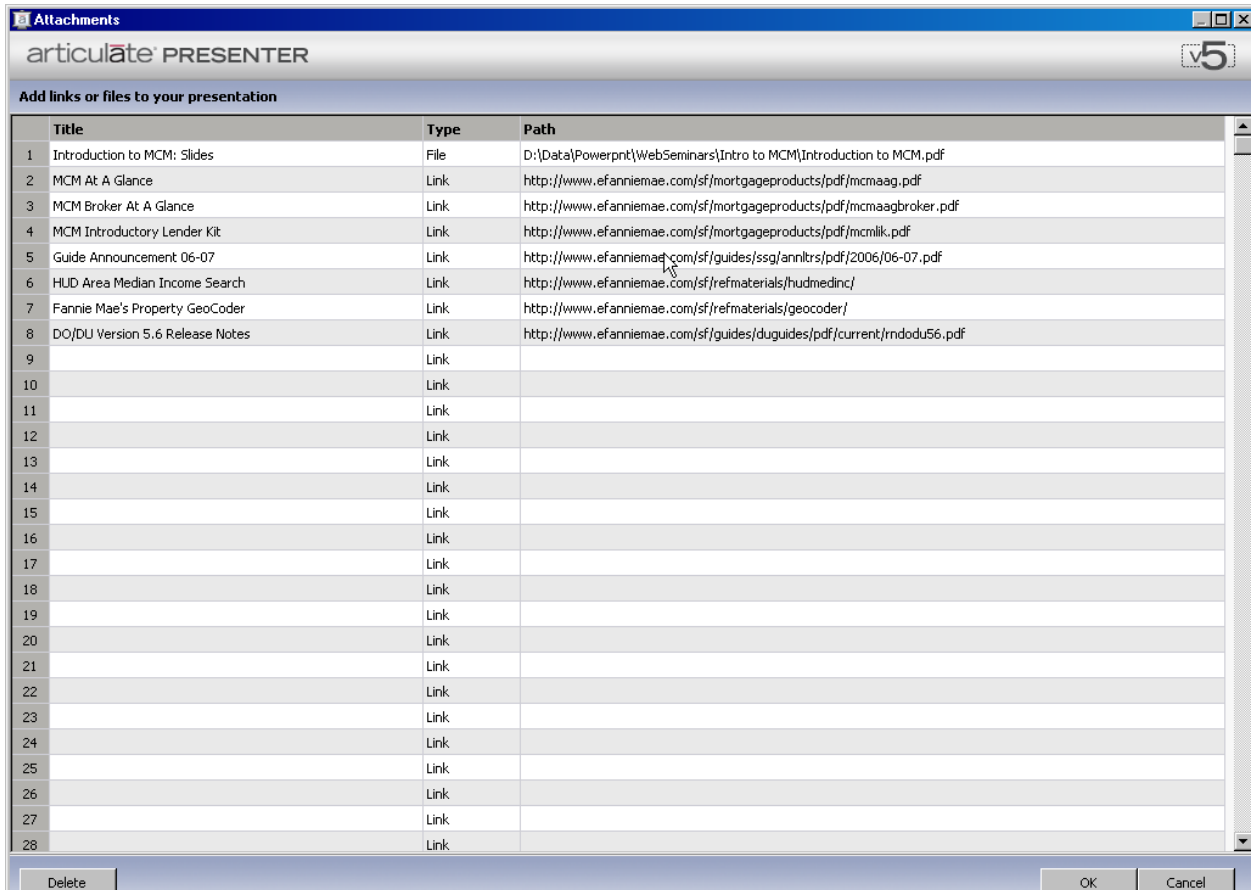
